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REGULATION ON THE ORGANIZATION AND CONDUCT
OF ADMISSION TO BACHELOR'S DEGREE STUDY PROGRAMS TAUGHT IN ENGLISH,
FOR THE 2026 – 2027 ACADEMIC YEAR

CHAPTER I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Art. 1

The Romanian-American University of Bucharest draws up and observes its own Regulation on the organization and conduct to admission to its study programs, according to its mission, institutional strategy and the labor market, in compliance with the law.

Art. 2

Based on university autonomy and public accountability, the Romanian-American University of Bucharest organizes an admission contest for every study program and cycle of academic studies, in view of testing knowledge and cognitive abilities, in compliance with the legal provisions in effect.

Art. 3

The organization and conducting of the admission contest to the bachelor's degree study programs taught in English is based on the following legislation:

- Law on higher education No 199/2023, with its additional modifications and amendments;
- Government Decision no. 1004/2002 regarding the pupils and students who have received distinctions at international school Olympiads organized for pre-academic education, with its subsequent modifications and amendments;
- Law no. 448/2006 bearing on the protection and observance of the rights of people with disabilities, republished, with its subsequent modifications and amendments;
- Order of the Minister of Education no. 5655/2024 for the approval of the Methodology regarding the admission of foreign citizens to study in university study cycles and postgraduate education, on study places with payment of tuition fees in foreign currency;
- Order of the Minister of Education no. 5760/2024 for the approval of the Regulation on the organization and functioning of the National Commission for the Recognition of University Degrees, Diplomas and certificates and scientific titles;
- Order of the Minister of Education no. 5552/2024 for the approval of the Methodology regarding the schooling conditions of Romanians abroad and foreign citizens within accredited state, private and private confessional higher education institutions in Romania;
- Order of the Ministry of Education no. 3693/2024 for the approval of the framework Methodology regarding the organization of the admission to bachelor, master and doctoral degree study cycles, with its subsequent modifications and amendments;
- Order of the Ministry of Education no. 5508/2024 regarding the approval of the Methodology for the recognition of bachelor's, master's, or postgraduate study documents issued by accredited higher education institutions abroad;

Art. 4

The Romanian-American University of Bucharest, a higher education institution, legal entity of private law and public utility, part of the national system of education, accredited by law, organizes in the 2025 – 2026 academic year the following bachelor's degree study programs taught in English, which have

been set up in compliance with the law:

Art. 5

- a. Admission to the bachelor's degree cycle of academic studies at the Romanian-American University of Bucharest is organized on bachelor's degree domains, accredited or authorized to operate provisionally in accordance with the legal provisions in force based on the university Regulation, which has been approved by the Senate, according to the legal provisions in effect.
- b. The admission contest for bachelor's degree programs will be organized *monthly*, starting on March 2, 2026, under the same conditions, until no later than September 25.
- c. The admission contest for the bachelor's degree academic studies for the programs that are taught in English is taken in English.
- d. The calendar for the admission sessions, as well as the forms and tests of the contest are established through the institutional Regulation and are made public in agreement with the legal provisions in effect, by being displayed at the university headquarters and on the web page of the institution.

Art. 6

The organization and conducting of the admission contest for the bachelor's degree cycle of academic studies lies within the competence of the Admission Central Committee of the Romanian-American University of Bucharest and of the Admission School Committees, named by Rector Decision, which are responsible for the adequate implementation of the current Regulation.

Art. 7

In agreement with the legal provisions in effect, the Romanian-American University of Bucharest informs the candidates, by display at the university headquarters and on the web page of the institution, on:

- a. The university admission regulation;
- b. The annual tuition offer;
- c. The terms and documents that are necessary for the registration, including the conditions and

procedure for the admission of foreign students and the recognition of the diplomas acquired abroad, in compliance with the law;

- d. The set calendar for the admission sessions;
- e. The conducting of the contest and the tests, the subjects and bibliography for the competition examinations;
- f. Facilities and special conditions, including individuals with disabilities, specific learning disorders, or special educational needs.
- g. Registration fees for organizing and conducting the admission;
- h. Other useful information for the candidates.

Art. 8

Admission to the bachelor's degree study programs taught in English at the Romanian-American University of Bucharest for the 2026 – 2027 academic year is based on a contest checking the candidates' level of knowledge of English (30%), an interview (60%) and taking into account the baccalaureate degree (10%).

Art. 9

The admission contest for the 2026 – 2027 academic year will take place monthly, under the same conditions, until no later September 25th.

Art. 10

- a. Only the students who have graduated from high school, with a baccalaureate diploma obtained in Romania or an equivalent, irrespective of the year of graduation, have the right to participate in the admission contest for the bachelor's degree academic studies.
- b. Citizens of the European Union member states and of the states belonging to the European Economic Space and to the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members, who are beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal / on the Brexit of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community 2019/C 384 I/01 may participate in the admission under the same conditions stipulated by the law for Romanian citizens, including as far as the tuition fees are concerned.
- c. The recognition of the studies pursued by citizens of other member states of the European Union, of states belonging to the European Economic Space and to the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union or by Romanian citizens abroad or in foreign education institutions located on Romanian territory falls within the area of competence of the specialized body in Ministry of Education and Research (additional information: <http://cnred.edu.ro>). In the case of recognition documents issued online by the specialist directorates of the Ministry of Education and Research, these are transmitted electronically to the secretary of the school by the candidate within the deadline set by the

university's own admission Regulations. For enrollment, candidates who submit the recognition document electronically are required to submit an affidavit confirming their place.

- d. The admission of Romanians from everywhere is based on the methodologies especially drafted by the Ministry of Education and Research.
- Thus, in accordance with the provisions of art. 1 paragraph (2) of Law no. 299/2007 on the support granted to Romanians everywhere, republished, with subsequent amendments and additions, the category of Romanians everywhere includes:
 - persons belonging to national minorities, linguistic minorities or indigenous Romanian ethnic groups or belonging to the Romanian cultural and ethnic lineage, existing in the states neighboring Romania and other states, who assume their Romanian ethnic, linguistic and cultural identity towards the Romanian authorities, regardless of the ethnonym used;
 - Romanian emigrants, regardless of whether they have retained Romanian citizenship, their descendants, as well as Romanian citizens with domicile or residence abroad;
 - ethnic groups who recognize themselves as of Romanian origin, located outside the country's borders, registered as another minority in the state of residence, who assume, through self-identification, belonging to the Romanian cultural and identity space.
- The aforementioned persons benefit from the rights of Romanians everywhere, provided that they declare on their own responsibility, based on their freely expressed will, in compliance with the conditions provided for by the Framework Convention for the Protection of National Minorities, that they assume the Romanian cultural identity, regardless of the name used in the state of citizenship or residence to designate the minority or community in question.
- e. The admission of citizens from non-European Union states is carried out in accordance with the methodologies specifically drafted by the Ministry of Education and Research.

In accordance with the provisions of art. 2 letter a) of Government Emergency Ordinance no. 194/2002 on the regime of foreigners in Romania, republished, with subsequent amendments and completions, a foreigner is a person who does not have Romanian citizenship, the citizenship of another Member State of the European Union or of the European Economic Area or the citizenship of the Swiss Confederation. as well as British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community 2019/C 384 I/01

Foreign citizens who cumulatively meet the following conditions are entitled to participate in the admission process, in accordance with the legal provisions in force:

- are graduates holding a baccalaureate diploma or an equivalent qualification, as applicable, and meet the admission requirements for university studies in their country of origin;
- hold a passport valid for at least six months from the start date of the study program for which they are applying;

- have not been subject to restrictive measures imposed by Romanian authorities, European institutions, or international bodies.

Art. 11

- a. The university has adopted, in compliance with the law, a set of measures regarding the equality of opportunity for people with disabilities, ensuring, where necessary, additional support customized for the needs of adults with disabilities, supporting their access inside the institution.
- b. According to the law, higher education institutions establish, within their own regulations, special facilities or conditions regarding the admission to bachelor's degree study programs of candidates that have received, during high school, distinctions in school Olympiads and/or other national or international competitions.
- c. Consequently, at the Romanian-American University of Bucharest, graduates of high schools where the language of teaching is English or who have obtained the average 10 in English at the baccalaureate examination, the 1st, 2nd and 3rd prizes, special mentions and awards at national and international school English Olympiads (recognized by the Ministry of Education and Research), as well as graduates of bachelor degree programs with an English language profile, or other profile but taught in English at accredited/authorized higher education institutions who wish to register for a second bachelor degree academic study program are admitted without taking an admission examination. International Olympic students who have obtained the average 10 (ten) at the baccalaureate examination in English are declared admitted with a 10 (ten). Those who have obtained prizes or distinctions at national school Olympiads in English may be admitted, having their mark for the Exam test equaled with a 10 (ten). Graduates who have a bachelor's degree diploma who register for a second bachelor's degree program may be admitted based on the equivalence of the admission average with the general average of the years of undergraduate studies.
- d. Candidates who present certificates issued by the Ministry of Education and Research or acknowledged by it, as well as certificates of English recognized internationally may be admitted based on them, the grade from the certificate or its equivalent representing the grade for the Exam test.
- e. Candidates who have an international certificate of English at an upper-intermediate or advanced level, as well as those who have studied exclusively in English and those whose official language is English may be admitted based on the assessment performed as a result of an online interview, through audio-video conference (for instance, Zoom/Microsoft Teams), having their grade equaled for the Exam test according to the equivalence grid.

Art. 12

- a. Romanian citizens, those of European Union member states, of states belonging to the European Economic Space and the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union, may be admitted and registered as students of at most two study programs simultaneously, irrespective of the cycle of studies and

the education institutions providing them, according to the law. Candidates from Third States may be admitted to only one study program, as they can receive only one Acceptance Letter from the Ministry of Education and Research.

b. Romanian candidates, those from European Union member states, from states belonging to the European Economic Space and the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union, may register for more schools/majors/study programs, under the following conditions:

- They submit a registration dossier for every school whose study program/major they opt for;
- They pay the contest registration fee for every option that they make;
- They take only one Exam test (in English) for all the schools/study programs that they have registered for.

Art. 13

The admission contest registration fee is **150 EUR for EU citizens and 250 EUR for non-EU citizens.**

Art. 14

The subject for the contest is English.

Art. 15

The content of the tests for the assessment of the level of linguistic competence corresponds to the best international practices in the field.

Art. 16

The Central Admission Committee will make the information regarding the conducting of the admission contest and its results public by displaying it at the University headquarters and on the website page, under the assigned heading.

CHAPTER II

REGISTRATION OF CANDIDATES FOR THE ADMISSION CONTEST

Art. 17

a. Registration for the contest shall be carried out as follows

a1. For Romanian citizens, registration will take place online between March 2 and September 24, at any time, regardless of the day

a2. For citizens of the European Union member states, states belonging to the European Economic Space and the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members,

as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union, the admission will take place under the same conditions as for the Romanian citizens (provided that the requirements regarding the recognition and equivalence of diplomas should be observed).

a3. For citizens of third countries, registration takes place from March 2 until August 21 (for those requiring a study visa) or until September 24 (for those who do not require a study visa).

Art. 18

- a. Each candidate must register on the admission platform.
- b. Enrollment for the admission exam may be carried out on behalf of the candidate by another person, based on a power of attorney.
- c. In the case of Romanian citizens, the examination file set according to Government Emergency Order no. 41/2016 on the establishment of measures to simplify the public central administration and the completion of normative acts does no longer contain the requirement to submit certified copies of documents, which are to be replaced by copies acknowledged as compliant with the original by the person/s in charge with this responsibility.

Art. 19

Documents necessary for registration for the examination are:

- **Standard registration form** (standard institutional form – *Annex 1*) – electronically generated, based on the documents submitted at registration.
 - **1 online passport type photo**, size 3/4 cm;
 - **Statutory declaration regarding the authenticity of the documents** uploaded on the dedicated platform and the correspondence between the digital/scanned documents and the original ones.
 - **Proof of English skills:**
 - i. Either an internationally recognized English qualification certificate;
 - ii. Either proof of undergoing your previous education fully taught in English;
 - iii. Either obtain an online pass in the Romanian-American University English Test.
- a. **For candidates from third countries:**
- **High school diploma or equivalent** – in photocopy and a certified translation (from the original) authenticated by the competent authorities of the issuing country;
 - **Transcript of Records** – in photocopy and certified translation (from the original);
 - **Birth certificate** – photocopy and certified translation;
 - **Passport**, simple photocopy;
 - **Proof of name change** (if applicable), in photocopy and certified translation;

- **Health certificate** (in an international language), which acknowledges that the person who is about to register for the studies does not suffer from contagious disease or any other conditions incompatible with their future profession;
- **An official document which indicates the candidate's permanent residence**, photocopy;
- **Application for the issuance of the letter of acceptance**, according to the procedures of the Ministry of Education and Research;

All documents should be either in Romanian, English, French, Spanish or Italian. Otherwise, certified translations into one of these languages have to be submitted.

b. For candidates from the EU/EEA/UK:

- **Standard form**, according to CNRED procedures;
- **High school diploma or equivalent** – in photocopy, if the document is in Romanian/English/French/Spanish/Italian, respectively copy and authenticated copy (in original) in Romanian language, for the documents issued in the other foreign languages, bearing an apostille or are authenticated, according to the CNRED procedures;
- **A school record** for the last 2 years which indicates the studied subjects and the achieved grades - in photocopy, if the document is in Romanian/English/French/Spanish/Italian, and in photocopy and a certified translation (from the original) into Romanian for documents issued in any other foreign languages;
- **Personal identification documents**, in photocopy: passport/ID and proof of name change (if applicable), in photocopy (Romanian/English/French/Spanish/Italian) and certified translation (for *all the other languages*);
- **Birth certificate**, photocopy and certified translation;
- **Health certificate** (in an international language), which acknowledges that the person who is about to register for the studies does not suffer from contagious disease or any other conditions incompatible with their future profession.

c. For Romanian citizens:

c1. Romanian citizens with studies in Romania:

- **High school diploma or equivalent**, in photocopy. Candidates who passed the high school graduation examination in the sessions of the 2025 – 2026 academic year will also submit their high school diploma or a certificate issued by the education institution which should specify the general average obtained in the high school graduation examination and the fact that the diploma has not been issued yet). By way of exception, for candidates who passed the high school graduation examination in the sessions of the 2025 – 2026 academic year, based on a written agreement, higher education institutions can interconnect with the Integrated Romanian electronic system of education (SIIR) in order to take over personal data and the results obtained in this examination by such candidates, in which case the certificate issued by the said education institution is no longer needed;
- **Transcript accompanying the high school diploma or equivalent**, in photocopy;

- **Birth certificate**, photocopy;
- **Marriage certificate** (if applicable), photocopy;
- **Health certificate** issued by the family doctor or (school or local) medical practices, which indicates that the candidate is capable to attend academic studies;
- **Bachelor's degree or equivalent**, accompanied by the Diploma Supplement/Transcript (in photocopy), for those who wish to register for a second School. Candidates who passed the Bachelor degree examination in the sessions of the 2025 – 2026 academic year may submit, instead of the Bachelor degree, a graduation certificate, signed by the dean and the head secretary of the respective School, issued under the law, in photocopy, and which indicates the general average, the averages of the years of study, the validity term and the fact that the diploma has not been released yet;
- **High school diploma** (certified photocopy) *and a certificate* which stipulates the quality of student in the 2026 - 2027 academic year and the form of education (for students who simultaneously attend the courses of another School), with the observation "High school diploma Series... and Number... is in the student's file" signed by the dean and head secretary of the respective School;
- **Identity card**, in photocopy.

c2. Romanian citizens with studies abroad or who graduated high school institutions which organize and carry out, on Romania's territory, training activities corresponding to an educational system from a foreign country:

c2.1 Candidates with certificates issued by CNRED:

- **High school diploma or equivalent**, in photocopy;
- **"Equivalence certificate"** issued by the Ministry of Education and Research if they studied in an international education system;
- **Transcript which accompanies the high school diploma or equivalent**, in photocopy;
- **Birth certificate**, photocopy;
- **Marriage certificate** (if applicable), photocopy;
- **Health certificate** (in an international language) issued by the family doctor or by (school or local) medical practices, which acknowledges that the person who is about to register for the studies does not suffer from contagious disease or any other conditions incompatible with their future profession;
- **High school diploma** (certified photocopy) *or a certificate* which specifies the quality of student in the 2025-2026 academic year, as well as the form of education (for student who simultaneously attend the courses of another SCHOOL), with the observation "High school diploma Series Number... is in the student's file", signed by the dean and head secretary of the said school;
- **Identity card and Passport**, in photocopy.

c2.2 Candidates with no certification issued by CNRED:

- **Standard form**, according to CNRED procedures;

- **High school diploma or equivalent**, in photocopy, if the document is issued in Romanian/English/French/Italian/Spanish; and a certified translation into Romanian (with an electronic signature from the notary) for documents issued in any other foreign language, accompanied by an apostille and over-certification in accordance with the CNRED procedure.
- **A school record for the last 2 years which indicates the studied subjects and the achieved grades** - in photocopy, if the document is in Romanian/English/French/Italian/Spanish, and in photocopy and a certified translation (with electronic signature from the notary) into Romanian for documents issued in any other foreign languages;
- **Birth certificate**, in photocopy;
- **Proof of name change** (if applicable), in photocopy (Romanian/English/French/Italian/Spanish) and certified translation (for any other languages);
- **Health certificate** (in an international language) issued by the family doctor or by (school or local) medical practices, which acknowledges that the person who is about to register for the studies does not suffer from contagious disease or any other conditions incompatible with their future profession;
- **Personal identification documents**, in photocopy: passport/identity card and proof of name change (if applicable), in photocopy (Romanian/English/French/Italian/Spanish) and certified translation (for any other languages).

d. For Romanian candidates from everywhere:

- **High school certificate/Diploma and transcript of records**;
- **Birth certificate**;
- **Marriage certificate** (if applicable, in case of name changing);
- **Passport** – first 3 pages;
- **Identity card**;
- **Medical certificate** stating that the applicant is fit to take bachelor's degree courses.
- **Declaration on one's own responsibility**, based on the freely expressed will, to assume the Romanian cultural identity, authenticated by the Romanian diplomatic mission in the country of origin or from the Department for Romanians Everywhere, according to the legislation;
- For candidates wishing to attend the second faculty (school), a **Bachelor's Degree or equivalent diploma** is added, accompanied by the Diploma Supplement / Registration Sheet;
- Graduates of the current year's promotion for whom the bachelor's degree has not been issued can electronically upload the graduation certificate with the bachelor's exam;

- For candidates who simultaneously attend another faculty (school), a Baccalaureate Diploma (photocopy) and a certificate showing student status in the current academic year and the form of education are required.
- e. For the admitted and enrolled students, Romanian citizens, those from EU/EEA/UK and Romanians from everywhere, original documents and/or photocopy of the original certified by the school secretariat, are submitted, before the beginning of the academic year, in physical format, at the school secretariat, in cardboard envelope file, on the cover mentioning the school, study program (specialization), form of education, name and surname of the candidate, email address and personal telephone number.
 - f. For the admitted and enrolled students from Third Countries, original documents and/or photocopy of the original are submitted, after students' arrivals in Romania, in physical format, at the International Recruitment and Admission Office, in cardboard envelope file, on the cover mentioning the school, study program (specialization), form of education, name and surname of the candidate, email address and personal telephone number. Then, their file will be forwarded and certified by the School secretariat.

Art. 20

Upon completion of the registration period, the information on the registration sheet cannot be changed.

CHAPTER III

ORGANISATION AND UNFOLDING OF THE ADMISSION EXAMINATION

Art. 21

Under the law, the following committees are set up at the Romanian-American University for the organization and performance at high quality standards of the examination for admission to Bachelor studies:

- Central Admission Committee;
- Admission committee for each School;
- Surveillance committee;
- Grading committee;
- Technical committee.

Art. 22

The Central Committee and the Technical Committee are set up at University level, through decision of the University Rector, with approval of the University Senate, having attributes delegated by the Senate, under the law.

Art. 23

The admission committee for each School, the surveillance committees and the grading committees are set through decision of the Rector, with approval of the University Senate, at the proposal of School Councils.

Art. 24

- a. The admission committee for each School consists of:
- the Chairman (School dean);
 - 2- 5 members;
 - a Secretary.
- b. The admission committee is also in charge of solving any potential problems related to the results of the online placement test (if applicable).
- c. The committee secretary has the sole attribution of managing documents.
- d. Under the law, the committee members may not have, with the candidates or among themselves, any relation of spouses, in-laws or relatives up to the third degree.

Art. 25

The responsibilities of the committees constituted for the organization and unfolding of the bachelor's degree admission examination, at the Romanian-American University, represents an annex to the present Regulation (*Annex 2*).

Art. 26

The commissions established at the school level shall communicate the final results of the admission exam to the Central Commission within 24 hours after the examination.

Art. 27

The *admission examination* is made up of an interview and an online placement test (if applicable), both in English. The date of the interview will be set at the time of the application, which can coincide with the date of application, or it can be scheduled at a later date. The interview represents 60% of the admission examination and the English test only 30%; they are not eliminatory, but if the candidate does not prove that he/she has an upper intermediate level of English, he will not be able to continue the admission procedure. The admission examination schedule will be made public every month on the university's web page, at the www.rau.ro address, dedicated section. Candidates have the obligation to check the correctness of the data on the lists and to inform the committees of any inconsistencies with real data. Foreign candidates have the possibility for an online interview and English language examination, via the audio-video conference technical means (e.g. Microsoft Teams).

Art.28

The **online** admission examination takes place as follows:

- a) The candidate will have the interview in English.
- b) The representative of the admission committee gets in contact with the candidate, via specific communication platforms (Zoom/Microsoft Teams), offering candidates the log in data and necessary instructions for the written test.
- c) The test lasts 80 minutes, from the moment when the candidate accesses the test.
- d) The test is made up of 45 questions, structured in two parts: grammar and vocabulary/ listening test.

- e) Candidates have the obligation to finish the test in 80 minutes, otherwise being considered invalid.
- f) After the end of the examination, the committee must communicate the results within a maximum of 2 days.

Art. 29

The attempted fraud (identity fraud, cheating, discussions with other candidates, etc.) will be immediately sanctioned, and candidates will be eliminated from competition/ examination, without any possibility to enroll in an admission examination at the Romanian-American University, in Bucharest.

Art. 30

The examination grids do not contain the identification data of the candidate (name, father's name, surname) or those with distinctive signs, will be considered invalid.

Art.31

- a. The average for admission is calculated based on the mark in the Exam test or equivalent (30%), the grade from the interview (60%) and the average of the baccalaureate (10%).
- b. The level of English cannot be lower than B1-B2.
- c. The average for admission cannot be lower than 5 (five), according to the law.
- d. If a grade lower than 5 (five) is obtained, the candidate is declared rejected.
- e. In case the applicant is rejected at the online Interview, fails the English test or doesn't receive the letter of acceptance from the Romanian Ministry of Education and Research, his overall admission grade will be 4.
- f. The admission average is calculated to two decimal places, as an integer number.
- g. The average for admission is valid for the classification order only at the Romanian-American University in Bucharest, on the bachelor program chosen by the candidates, according to the present Regulation.

Art. 32

The admission is limited to the numbers approved by the Senate of the university, according to the legal provisions in force, for each school, bachelor's degree/ major and form of studies, in the decreasing order of the admission average. When, on the final position, there are more students with the same average, they will be delimited according to the following criteria, in the below-mentioned order:

1. The mark on the admission examination or equivalent;
2. Average of the Baccalaureate;
3. Average of the marks in English, during the high school years.

Art. 33

For the bachelor's degree programs, where the number of accepted candidates is smaller than the

available number of seats, according to the decision of the university's Senate, the respective program will not be organized during the 2026-2027 academic year, and the candidates will have the possibility to opt for a different program (*Annex 3*).

Art. 34

a. The list with the admitted candidates will be made available in no more than 2 days from the date of the examination, at the headquarters of the Romanian-American University, in Bucharest, 1B, Expoziției Boulevard, Sector 1 and/or on the institutional web page, dedicated section.

b. The results will be made available gradually, generating the following types of lists:

- Provisional lists - with hierarchy of candidates, generated after admission;
- Final lists – with the hierarchy of the candidates, generated after the resolution of complaints, comprising the final and indisputable results;
- List of candidates rejected, if appropriate;
- List of pending candidates, if applicable.

Art. 35

Any appeal with regard to the results of the bachelor degree admission examination will be submitted to the university's registry office through the rectorat@rau.ro email address, in no more than 24 hours from the date of the publication of results and will be resolved by the School admissions board, within 48 hours.

a. The decision of the committee is final, according to the law.

b. Complaints are not admitted in case the present Regulation is not known.

c. After the deadline for resolving complaints has expired, the results of the admission examination shall be considered final and cannot be altered.

d. Validation of the changes on the initial scores by the Admission Committee of the School, involves a reassessment of the average grade of the respective candidate, as well as a new position on the general hierarchy list of the candidates, in a decreasing order, with all consequences involved. The application of this provision cannot influence in any way the situation of the candidates declared admitted initially.

Art. 36

The final results of the admission examination (after resolution of complaints) will be made available in the campus of the Romanian-American University in Bucharest, 1B, Expoziției Boulevard, Sector 1 and on the institutional web page, dedicated section, in maximum 4 calendar days from the examination.

CHAPTER IV

ENROLLMENT OF CANDIDATES DECLARED ADMITTED IN THE FIRST YEAR OF STUDIES

Art. 37

a. After resolution of complaints, candidates declared admitted have the obligation to sign the contract of studies and to pay the tuition fee for the 1st year of studies, in maximum 10 calendar days from the display of results and then to enroll in the academic year. The exception is for foreign citizens who will follow the same steps, but in order to enroll, they will have to wait for the letter for acceptance and the study visa.

b. Candidates declared admitted who do not respect the set deadline (10 calendar days from the display of results), can lose their position. In these conditions, on the positions that will now be available, can be declared new admitted citizens that were considered rejected before, but who passed the exam test, in the decreasing order of average grade, but within the legal limits of the tuition figure.

Art. 38

For the enrollment in the 1st year of studies, candidates declared admitted should:

- Fill in the 1st year of studies enrollment form request, for the academic year 2026 - 2027;
- Sign in the set deadline the contract of studies (*Annex 5*), which is valid throughout the entire bachelor studies period, 3 years respectively. The contract of studies between the enrolled students and the rector of the university, as the legal representative of the University, according to the law; after signing by the enrolling students, it will be scanned/ photocopied and sent at the following e-mail address: international@rau.ro;
- Pay the entire annual tax for studies in the set deadline.

Art. 39

Enrollment can be made after the candidate signed the contract of study, fully paid the annual tax, obtained the letter of acceptance and the student visa if necessary.

Art. 40

a. After enrollment, final lists are generated and displayed, with the candidates declared admitted and enrolled.

b. Enrollment of the candidates declared admitted after the admission examination is made by decision of the Rector.

c. After enrollment approval, students are enrolled in The Register of Unique Numbers of Romanian Universities - RMUR (until the operationalization of the Single National Integrated Register of Diplomas and Study Documents - RUNIDAS), with a unique number valid for the entire period of schooling in the specialization(s) /program(s) of study to which they were admitted, with the exceptions provided for in Art. 125 para. (3) of the Law on Higher Education No. 199/2023, as amended.

Art. 41

Candidates who have been declared rejected or who relinquish the position obtained through the contest, and do not request enrollment within the period established by this Regulation, may request the return of their submitted documents within 48 hours, upon presentation of an identity card or passport, without paying any fee.

Art. 42

a. Students that are citizens of the EU member states, of the European Economic Space and of the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union, ethnics Romanians, as well as Romanian citizens living abroad and/ or have graduated high school abroad can be admitted in the 1st year of studies by contest, only after they receive the recognition of their studies from the Ministry of Education and Research.

b. For foreign citizens, other than the above-mentioned ones, the letter of acceptance from the Ministry of Education and Research, according to the law, is necessary and mandatory, for registration. The value of the tax for this category of students is regulated in the contract of studies, according to the methodologies specific for each category of foreign citizens, according to the law.

c. For foreign citizens, others than the above-mentioned ones, study visa, issued by the Romanian authorities is mandatory for the enrollment, except for the citizens from states where specific regulations are in force or for those who have a labor permit for the entire period of studies.

CHAPTER V

FINAL PROVISIONS

Art. 43

The management of the Romanian-American University and the school staff assume the entire responsibility of the organization and unfolding of the admission examination, for the bachelor studies, according to the law.

Art. 44

Candidates declared admitted have the obligation to pay the entire value of the tax on a maximum of 10 calendar days from the display of results. Candidates from tertiary states will also pay the entire value of the tax in maximum 10 calendar days from the display of results but, in case they don't receive the Letter of Acceptance, the tuition fee will be refunded to them.

Art. 45

Candidates declared admitted can apply for tuition, according to the Regulations in force.

Art. 46

In exceptional situations, upon the approval of the administrative council, the Rector can decide to exonerate, from payment of tax, certain categories of students.

Art. 47

Until the issue of the enrollment decision, candidates declared admitted are not issued documents certifying their status of a student.

Art. 48

The enrollment for the admission examination confirms full compliance from the candidates' part, with the present methodology.

Art. 49

During Bachelor studies, students must be aware of and comply with the University Charta, any internal normative documents derived from it, the Regulation on students' professional activity, the regulations, methodologies and procedures approved by the University Senate, under the law.

Art. 50

On the date this Regulation is approved by the University Senate, all the previous internal regulations on the organization and unfolding of the admission examination for Bachelor study programs in English are abrogated.

Art. 51

The deans, the head secretary of the Romanian-American University in Bucharest and School head secretaries will apply the provisions of this Regulation, being in charge with the enforcement thereof.

This Regulation was approved by the Senate of the Romanian-American University in its session of July 30, 2025, and updated on March 25, 2026.
