- **Case Studies and Simulations:** Present a simulation or a case study used in your class.
- **Innovative Tools:** Showcase apps, technical solutions, or digital tools that enhance your teaching.
- **Study Materials:** Share engaging visuals, audio, videos, animations, or other educational materials you've created.
- **Practical Activities:** Demonstrate a hands-on or experiential learning activity conducted with your students.
- **Collaborative Projects:** Explain how you incorporate group projects or collaborative learning strategies.
- **Flipped Classroom Approaches:** Discuss how you've used pre-class assignments or online content to maximize in-class interaction.
- **Assessment Innovations:** Present examples of alternative assessment methods, such as peer reviews or self-assessment techniques.

These examples will not only illustrate diverse teaching strategies but also foster a collaborative environment where participants can gain new insights and ideas.

- **Erasmus Student Exchange Fair**
